#### Academic skills weekly top tip

This is the final weekly top tip, but I wanted to finish with a reminder to all students and parents/carers that there is a huge amount of academic skills support in College to help you with your studies:

- Students can go to the Academic Skills Service button on Moodle and choose 'What are Academic Skills?', to read information about revision techniques, time management, writing skills, exam technique, concentration, note taking, reading, motivation, distributed practice, or good habits for success.
- Students can also access interactive resources in the same place on Moodle about time management and organisation, revision and consolidation, and planning for learning.
- There is a section in the College library with helpful books and resources about study skills and ways to develop as an independent learner.

#### Register to vote

Can I please encourage all our 18+ students to <u>register to vote</u> in the general election. The National Union of Students (NUS) is asking all students to make a simple pleage to vote which can be found <u>here</u>.

Once you have pledged to vote, the NUS will send you:

- Information on how to register to vote.
- Information on how to get your free Voter ID.
- Information on how to vote.
- Reminders to vote on polling day.

#### **Toilet facilities**

In my weekly message of 17 May, I asked all students to treat the toilet facilities in College as they would at home or at work. Please note that toilet facilities in five blocks on campus are now being monitored by CCTV.

These cameras are positioned in the corridors, near the amenities, *not* in the actual facilities themselves. Prominent signs will denote which areas are being monitored by cameras. #### Independent study days


