# **Careers Fair**

Greenhead's annual 'Step Into Your Future Careers Fair' was held last Friday and was, once again, very successful. The aim of the event was to bring students into contact with representatives from higher and further education, industry, and the charity/voluntary sector.

This year, we were very lucky to welcome back many alumni from a range of organisations to talk to our students about their post-A Level experience. The event was very busy, with around 90 organisations in attendance (see pictures, below).

Visitors' feedback was overwhelmingly positive, with one commenting: "I have been to (careers) fairs around the country and the Greenhead College students appear to be the most prepared and knowledgeable about their subject areas and course requirements. Very impressed!"

We will continue to invite organisations into College on a weekly basis in the next academic year.







#### Manifesto for nature recovery


Staff have reported to me that students' behaviour and commitment were exceptional, so well done to all those who took part – I'm sure it was an amazing experience!

## Start of term arrangements

Can I remind students that the new term will start on **Thursday, 29 August**, not on **Monday, 2 September**, which was the date previously advertised in my assembly in March.

# **Bursary support**

Current A1 students can apply for their 2024-2025 Student Bursary from **Monday, 8 July**. Bursary support is subject to household income/circumstances. Household income must be below £28,000 (excluding benefits) to qualify.

The College will consider any application with household income from £28,000 up to £30,000 (if funding allows) and providing the application has been made in full before the deadline date of **Monday, 30 September**. Please see the Student bursary Moodle page for further details.

# A1 results day

This is an important message for those **A1 students** who have studied:

- **Maths** (Maths and Further Maths students only),
- Core Maths.
- Medical Science and
- Health and Social Care.

On **Thursday**, **15 August** at **8.00 am**, the overall grade for these subjects will be available to view on Cedar. Locate the green menu on the left side of the screen, click on the A+ **Exams and Results** link, and select **Exam Results**.



A hard copy of the results sheet will be available on your return in September.

If you have any concerns about the grade awarded (and we hope this will not be the case), it is vital that you speak to Exams staff as soon as you can. There are strict deadlines to be adhered to for post results services, including access to scripts and reviews of marking.

All applications for post results queries must be administered through the Exams Office (M24) which will be open as follows:

# A2 results day

On **Thursday**, **15 August**, log in to Cedar from **8.00 am** to view your results on the **Results** tab. Locate the green menu on the left side of the screen, click on the A+ **Exams and Results** link and select **Exam Results**.



Your subject results will be reported as an overall grade. Information regarding marks achieved and grade boundaries will also be available once this is published by the exam boards.

Results slips will be posted to your home address in the days following results day and will provide confirmation of what you have viewed on Cedar. The Cedar results page can also be printed, if needed.

After checking your results, please log on to your UCAS Hub as soon as possible to check your University place.

If you achieve what you're hoping for, many congratulations and well done!

Results day celebration event: This will take place on results day from 9.00-10.00 am in the Hirst building canteen area and will be a great opportunity to come back to Greenhead College to celebrate with friends, family and College staff.

There will be music, a celebration drink and a small gift for you to take away. To help us determine gift and drink requirements, please complete this <u>online form</u> by **Friday**, **19 July**, to let us know whether you will be attending. If you miss this deadline, you are of course still very welcome to attend on the day, though we cannot guarantee a drink/gift.



Results day queries: Having received your results, you may wish to speak in person to a member of staff from our Careers team or a member of senior staff. Do come into College to obtain any further welfare or career-related support you may need. (Please ensure you wear your lanyard, complete with student card.)
